“Love or Justice?”

One sunny afternoon a couple of years ago, I went for a walk around our local mere with my daughter and my 3-year-old mixed-race granddaughter. We met several people, all of whom seemed friendly and happy to

chat, albeit from a distance! “Aren’t people friendly?” I said to my daughter. “That’s because you look like them, Mum”, she replied. Her comment left me questioning: “will these people be as friendly and accepting of our little one as she grows up, based upon no information other than the colour of her skin?” How welcoming are we to those who identify as being of global majority heritage?

Racial Justice Sunday takes place annually on the second Sunday in February. While it falls on 9th February this year, it has, in previous years, coincided with St Valentines day. On those occasions, I have noticed that some colleagues have been left with a dilemma about what they should preach on. Should they use the tradition of red roses, poems, greeting cards and date nights to

preach about love, in a nod to St Valentine, or should they focus on transforming the unjust structures of society to address the need for racial justice?

Some might say to me “Well, we could focus on Racial Justice, but, seeing as it’s Valentine’s Day, we’d better focus on love”.

I would describe myself as someone who seeks to end discrimination of any kind, and would argue that any question of choice between love and justice can’t be made because the two are not mutually exclusive. God created love and God created a diverse people. Then “God saw all that he had made, and it was very good” (Gen. 1:31). I believe that real, God-inspired justice always consists of mercy, compassion and, most of all, love. Therefore, justice and love are two sides of the same coin.

For me, justice is also love in action, because if we really love someone, we want to ensure that they are free, equal, and treated with respect and dignity. In short, we want to ensure they have all that we have, which is synonymous with “loving your neighbour as yourself” (Matthew 22:39).

I pray that each of us will value and celebrate diversity. The mission of the Church is the mission of Christ, and I pray that we would respond to human need by loving service, transforming the unjust structures of society, doing as much as we can to enable peace and reconciliation.

Paul writes in his letter to the Galatians 3:28: “There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus”.

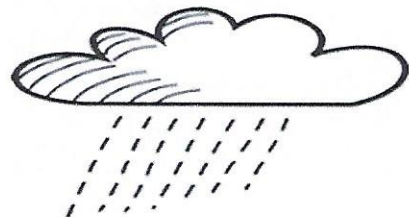

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF HOCKHAM PARISH COUNCIL ON MONDAY JAN 6TH 2025
IN HOCKHAM VILLAGE HALL

Present; Councillors; Bennett (Chair) Lambert, Lloyd, Thomas Loft, Leech and Wiltshire, the clerk C Garrod, plus 5 members of the public.

- 1) **Apologies for absence;** Councillor Cowen
- 2) **Declarations of interest,** Councillor Lambert as landlord and owner of the Eagle, Councillor leech as a farmer at Little Hockham, Councillors Bennett and Loft as allotment holders.
- 3) **Requests for dispensation.** None
- 4) **Minutes from 09/12/24.** Unanimously approved.
- 5) **Progress.**
 - a) **Wheelchair ramp.** Purchased and used. It was agreed to remove some soil to make the ramp steadier.
 - b) **Info board.** No further progress.
 - c) **Website.** Councillor Wiltshire was investigating.
 - d) **Drainage.** NCC highways have investigated some drains. It was believed they would camera survey the drain by the Eagle.
 - e) **Bollards.** NCC Highways would not install bollards.
- 6) **The meeting was adjourned for public participation.**
- 7) District and County Council reports. Councillor Cowen had sent a report that was read out by the clerk. (Added in full to minutes)
- 8) **Highways and Road Safety (Cllr Thomas).** The sign on the Watton Rd had been fixed. The condition of Parliament Lane would be reported. Some overgrown hedges would be investigated opposite side of the road to the village fields.
- 9) **Planning Applications and Planning Issues.** As a result of the NPPF changes, the leader of Breckland council had issued a note to say that housing numbers needed to increase by approx. 40%. Two planning appeals were in progress, Sunnyside and Springfield.
- 10) **Finances.** There was £18238.15 in the bank. Approval was given for payments to the clerk for salary of £186.96, village hall water for allotments of £109.68, Pearce and Kemp for streetlight maintenance for £45.60 and to Serco for grass cutting at £1497.98. The latter would need to be an electronic payment and councillor Lambert and Leech agreed to progress the online authorisation.
- 11) **Allotments (Cllr Bennett).** One half had been re let on Harling Rd.
- 12) **Footpaths and Rights of Way (Cllr Loft).** The trod needed a new surface. NCC highways would be contacted.
- 13) **Playing Field.** A meeting was due soon. The chair congratulated the Xmas tree team for the lights this Xmas. It was agreed the PC would fund any new or replacement lights. There was £16907.95 in the bank plus some cash in a float. The benches were soon to be located. An independent inspection of play equipment had highlighted no new issues, and all the old issues had been sorted.
- 14) **In Touch.** An in-depth letter had been received for the In Touch Committee. A meeting would be convened between the two parties.
- 15) **Community Car Scheme.** No new drivers had been found yet. A notice would go on the notice board.

- 16) **Councillor Updates.** Following the public participation, it was agreed to investigate a footpath opposite North Farm. NCC would be contacted re land ownership. It was asked if an update on the Harling Surgery Practice could be sought.
- 17) **Correspondence.** None other than that which had already been dealt with.
- 18) **Next meeting** Monday 10th Feb 2025

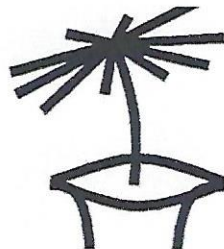
